# RMCG Covid-19 Vaccination Policy

In no case will travelers be permitted to wait until the departure date to provide this information. Please guard your original Covid-19 certificates as you would any important document. We will only require a COPY of your completed certificate, do not mail us any original documents.

**Highlights:** Before we go on to the major part of our tour, we will spend a day seeing sites in Quito, the capitol of Ecuador, including Middle of the World, the equatorial line. Then, we take this opportunity to visit a place like no other in the world: The Galapagos Islands where Charles Darwin found animals found nowhere else. These islands are famous for their Giant Tortoises, flamingos and other native birds, tropical fish, sea lions, penguins, manta rays, lava lizards, and massive marine iguanas. Sites included in this tour are the following: Santa Cruz Island (Los Gemelos volcanic sinkholes, Manzanillo ranch, Giant Tortoise Reserve, lava tunnels, the main town of Puerto Ayora, the Charles Darwin Station); Isabella Island (the town of Puerto Villamil, the Sierra Negra Volcano, the Muro de las Lagrimas natural habitat, the Arnoldo Tupiza breeding center, and the Concha Perla bay).
