Day 12: Cadiz (Seville), Spain - Indulge in the culture of Andalusia's capital of Seville and visit its stunning Cathedral, one of the largest in the world. Stop and taste the tapas and smell the orange blossoms during a stroll down the winding Medieval lanes. But be sure you leave time to visit the breathtaking Plaza de Espana.

Day 13: Malaga (Granada), Spain - The strategic position to the Mediterranean Sea has always made Malaga an attractive zone for foreign invasions. From Malaga, a trip to Granada showcases an intriguing blend of Arab and European cultures. Be sure to visit The Alhambra, one of the finest examples of Moorish art in Spain.

Day 14: Cartagena, Spain - Along the Mediterranean coast of Spain lies a seaport that traces its history back to the Roman Empire. Today manicured promenades lined with palm trees lead you to ancient ruins surviving marvelously between modern-day buildings. This is an urban explorer's paradise, whether you prefer to discover the archaeological sites at the museum of Roman Theatre or stroll the charming Paseo Alfonso XII your stop in Cartagena will sure to be memorable.

Day 15: Palma Majorca, Spain - Wander in any direction from the awe-inspiring Gothic Cathedral at its geographic and historical heart and you'll find bent medieval streets lined with aristocratic townhouses, looming baroque churches, teeming public squares, vibrant bohemian neighborhoods and markets overflowing with all the bounty of the island.

Day 16: Barcelona, Spain - Barcelona, is a place of palpable history, where you can lose yourself strolling down the medieval streets of the city. Municipal markets, art galleries and antique shops can be found in Barcelona alongside crafts shops, fashion shops and open-air markets. A must see is the UNESCO World Heritage sites, Gaudi's La Sagrada Familia, also known as one of the largest unfinished Roman Catholic basilicas.

Day 17: Cannes, France - This legendary seaside port has all the glitz and allure: private beaches, marinas filled with luxury yachts, stylish boulevards, elegant Belle Epoque hotels, and fashionable restaurants. The weather is mild year-round and perfect for sunbathing by the beach from May through October. Leafy palm trees grace the streets of Cannes, and subtropical flowers flourish throughout the city, giving visitors the impression of being in paradise.

Day 18: Florence (Livorno/Pisa), Italy - Few cities are so compact in size or so packed with extraordinary art and architecture masterpieces at every turn. Visiting sites such as Santa Croce, Piazza del Duomo and Michelangelo's David makes it easy to get around on foot.
